How to clean solar panels without using water?

Dry cleaning is another best method to clean solar panels if you want to avoid using water in cleaning solar panels. You can consider the following techniques. If the surface of your solar panels is covered with light dust, dirt, or debris, you can use a soft-bristle brush or broom to get rid of it.

How to clean solar panels?

You won't need any specialist equipment to clean your solar panels. A hose, a soft sponge, and a bucket should be enough to do the job. Pressure washers aren't advisable, as they can easily damage the solar cells. Instead of using soap, spray your panels with diluted white vinegar and then wipe them down with a sponge.

That said, most solar PV panels in the UK will not need any heavy-duty cleaning because regular rain will wash most dirt and grime off the surface, dispelling one of the myths about solar being its difficulty to clean.

How do you clean solar panels without a squeegee?

If you don't have a squeegee, a microfiber cloth can be used as an alternative. Microfiber cloths are soft, non-abrasive and absorbent, making them ideal for cleaning solar panels. Gently wipe the panels with the cloth to remove any remaining water droplets. Be sure to use a clean and dry cloth to avoid any smudging or streaking.
