The project will construct solar farms in Guadalcanal and Malaita provinces with a total capacity of 2.5 megawatts. It will also install the country's first utility-scale grid-connected battery energy storage system to integrate more renewable energy into the grid.

The project will finance new solar farms in Guadalcanal and Malaita province, along with a utility-scale grid-connected energy storage system in Honiara. Nearly all of Solomon Islands' grid power is diesel generated.
