

Why is Fingrid limiting electricity export capacity to Estonia?

Once the repairs are completed, Fingrid will still have to limit electricity export capacity to Estonia for the next few days due to construction work on a substation in southern Finland. "The repair operation on the Estonian coast has gone very well led by Elering, despite the exceptional complexity of the repair.

When will Estonian grid be reconnected?

Kaja Kallas said the parties' systems administrators would announce the new deadline for reconnection in August 2024. The coalition deal signed in April between Reform, Eesti 200 and the Social Democrats states that the Estonian grid would be connected to the continental European grid by 2025 at the latest. --

What happened to Finland's second electricity link between Estonia & Finland?

The repair work on the second electricity transmission link between Finland and Estonia has been completed and the link is expected to return to commercial operation on Wednesday. The EstLink 2 electricity interconnector has been out of service since the end of January due to a fault.

Will Estonia and Latvia leave the Russian electricity grid before 2025?

The Prime Ministers of Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania announced at a meeting in Tallinn in May that they would be taking steps towards leaving the Russian electricity grid and joining the continental European grid earlier than the currently planned end of 2025, pending technical issues.

How long will Estonia be able to connect to the European network?

At the same time, Estonia has confirmed that in an emergency situation it would be able to hook up to the continental European network, within 12 hours at the most.

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In the event of an emergency or a disruption in service from Moscow, the Baltic states are able to synchronize

with the EU grid on an accelerated timetable. Estonia's former Prime Minister Kaja Kallas warned, "Russia's aggression in Ukraine and its use of energy as a weapon proves that it's a dangerous and unpredictable country, and ...
