The state utility's first grid-tied solar project is designed to complement EDG's nearby 75MW Garafiri hydroelectric power plant, helping to offset the impact of fluctuating rainfall on hydropower generation.

Khoumagueli will be Guinea's first grid-connected solar power plant, adding 40MWp of much-needed, renewable energy to the country's 566 MW national grid. Located near the city of Linsan in the Province of Kindia, the plant will connect to existing grid infrastructure.

As one of Guinea's earliest renewable IPP initiatives, the Khoumagueli project has used grant funding from PIDG's Technical Assistance (TA) to support work to build government capacity to undertake future renewable energy projects with the private sector.

The PPA milestone was announced on Wednesday by InfraCo Africa, which is developing the project with the support of Aldwych Africa Developments Ltd, in partnership with French solar developer Solveo Energie SAS. It comes after a concession agreement was signed in February 2019.
