

# Hex substation Cocos Keeling Islands

How do the Cocos (Keeling) Islands communicate?

The Cocos (Keeling) Islands have access to a range of modern communication services. Digital television stations are broadcast from Western Australia via satellite. A local radio station, 6CKI - Voice of the Cocos (Keeling) Islands, is staffed by community volunteers and provides some local content.

Where can I watch the Cocos (Keeling) Islands?

It is available in paper and electronic formats. The Cocos (Keeling) Islands receives a range of digital channels from Western Australia via satellite and is broadcast from the Airport Building on the West Island on the following VHF frequencies: ABC6, SBS7, WAW8, WOW10 and WDW11

Why are the Cocos Islands called the Keeling Islands?

The territory's dual name (official since the islands' incorporation into Australia in 1955) reflects that the islands have historically been known as either the Cocos Islands or the Keeling Islands. The territory consists of two atolls made up of 27 coral islands, of which only two - West Island and Home Island - are inhabited.

What power does Western Australia have over the Cocos Islands?

The Act also gives Western Australian courts judicial power over the islands. The Cocos Islands remain constitutionally distinct from Western Australia, however; the power of the state to legislate for the territory is power-delegated by the federal government.

A celebration event was held yesterday, 9 November, for the 5-hour duration Hex BESS project in the Western Cape Province town of Worcester. The project gets its name from Eskom's Hex substation to which it connects it to the grid, close to the Hex River.

The Hex site is in Worcester in South Africa's Western Cape, and features large-scale utility batteries with 1.44 gigawatt-hours of total capacity and 60MW of solar photovoltaic (PV) capacity. This project can store up to 100MWh of electricity, enough to power a town for five hours, and will feature 2MW of PV capacity.

The subject is a former Quarantine Station site also known as Ras Site 1 - Location 205(V) West Island.

The site is zoned as "Special Use" in the Shire of Cocos (Keeling) Islands Local Planning Scheme No. 1 (LPS). The zoning is illustrated in Figure 2.
