

Moldova battery storage sites wanted

The US government has pledged to make a USD 85-million (EUR 78.3m) investment into Moldova''s energy segment by supporting the deployment of large-scale battery energy storage capacity in the Eastern European country.

The integration of large-scale RES installations in Moldova will require significant changes in the operational practices of the utilities. The grid will need additional flexibility in the generation mix, as well as large-scale battery energy storage and efficient demand-side management tools.

During his visit to Moldova, U.S. Secretary of State Antony Blinken announced an investment of \$85 million, IPN reports. The U.S. Secretary of State visited, together with Prime Minister Dorin Recean, the power station in Braila.

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To improve the reliability of Moldova''s electrical grid, a new large battery electric storage system (BESS) and other additional equipment will be purchased. US Secretary of State Antony Blinken announced this today in Chisinau at a joint press conference with Head of State Maia Sandu, MOLDPRES reports.

The United States will allocate 85 million dollars to Moldova for the purchase of a battery energy storage system. The U.S. Secretary of State, Antony Blinken, announced this at a briefing following a visit to a power plant where batteries will be installed to stabilize the power supply system in case of need.



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
