

What energy sources are available in Mozambique?

Mozambique has abundant energy sources available for exploitation. As of 2021, the country was ranked first in energy potential of all the countries in the Southern African Power Pool (SAPP), with an estimated energy capacity of 187,000 MW. Available energy sources include coal, hydroelectricity, natural gas, solar energy and wind power.

Is biomass a source of electricity in Mozambique?

Traditional biomass - the burning of charcoal, crop waste, and other organic matter - is not included. This can be an important source in lower-income settings. Mozambique: How much of the country's electricity comes from nuclear power? Nuclear power - alongside renewables - is a low-carbon source of electricity.

What is Mozambique's new energy grid?

Located in Niassa province, one of Mozambique's most underserved provinces with an electrification rate of just over 20 per cent, the \$36 million project will provide clean energy to 18,000 households and support the creation of local jobs. The project marks a significant milestone as the first IPP grid-scale storage plant in sub-Saharan Africa.

How much electricity does Mozambique use a year?

In 2018, with an "average operating generation capacity of 2,279 MW", the country had an electricity consumption of 415 kWh per person, per year, about 50 kWh higher than the then prevailing average for Sub-Saharan Africa. It is estimated that 85 percent of electricity consumption in Mozambique is consumed by industry.

What is the largest power station in Mozambique?

The 2,075 megawatts Cahora Bassa Hydroelectric Power Station (CBHPS) across the Zambezi River, is the largest power station in Mozambique. The power station is operated by Hidroelectrica de Cahora Bassa (HCB), a Mozambican parastatal company.

How much natural gas does Mozambique have?

Mozambique has proven natural gas reserves in excess of 180 trillion cubic feet. In the north of the country, AREA1 is under concession to TotalEnergies. AREA4 is concessioned to ENI and ExxonMobil.

The plant is the first IPP in Mozambique to integrate a utility-scale energy storage system and includes an upgrade to the existing Cuamba substation. The Cuamba Solar plant supplies enough power for 21,800

consumers over the project's life and is expected to avoid the equivalent of more than 172,000 tonnes of CO<sub>2</sub> emissions
