Are solar panels a scam?

That is, of course, also a scam. To protect yourself from clean energy scams: Know that "free" or "no cost" solar panel offers are scams. The federal government does not install solar systems in homes for free. Are 'fake' solar companies a scam?

Beware of any company asking you to make a big deposit before they have completed their installation. This is one of the most common ways 'fake' solar companies have targeted consumers - whereby they take a hefty deposit and then never turn up to carry out the installation. This is common solar scam.

What are energy scams?

Energy scams involve people pretending to be energy companies or regulators to get your money or personal information. These scammers may pretend to be your energy company, say they're from Ofgem or even from Energy Saving Trust to try and gain your trust.

What should I do if a solar business is a scam?

Protect your personal information. Don't respond to unexpected requests online or on social media for your name, address, or other personal information to "see if you qualify." At best, this is someone generating leads to sell, not actual solar businesses. At worst, they're scammers trying to steal your identity.

Are solar panels legit or mis-sold?

Connect panel members with solar panels. Some product offers can be legitimate and worthwhile - but sometimes they're being mis-sold. Think carefully about the claims made about any product you're being offered, and work out if it will benefit your system. A cold-caller on your doorstep or phone doesn't give you time to think things through.

Are solar business leads a scam?

At best, this is someone generating leads to sell, not actual solar businesses. At worst, they're scammer trying to steal your identity. If you spot a scam, tell the Federal Trade Commission at [ReportFraud.ftc.gov](https://www.ftc.gov/identity-theft).
