When asked about measures the country can take to curb the rapid tariff increase, Eswatini Energy Regulatory Authority (ESERA) CEO, Sikhumbuzo Tsabedze hinted at ongoing government initiative­s aimed at securing sustainabl­e power generation, which he believes will alleviate some of the financial pressures facing the energy sector.

Prince Lonkokhela, the minister of Natural Resources and Energy, announced at the event that Eswatini is set to increase its electricity generation capacity by 241 megawatts as of July 2026 in an ambitious goal for universal, affordable, reliable and modern energy by 2030.
