

Tonga integrated pv system

WHAT SYSTEM IS USED?

The system includes a 300kW solar plant and a 2 Mega-watt hour battery energy storage system, which will enable TPL to integrate renewable energy into its electricity grid and provide reliable power to customers.

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The Tonga Outer Island Renewable Energy Project (OIREP) will construct Solar Photovoltaic (PV) power plants on 8 outer islands. The "on-grid" portion will be allocated to Ha"apai and "Eua, while the "off-grid" portion will incorporate "Uiha, Nomuka, Ha"ano, ...

A solar-plus-storage project combining 300kW of PV and a 2MWh battery energy storage system (BESS) has been installed in the Polynesian archipelago nation of Tonga. The project on the island of Vava"u was commissioned by Tonga Power Limited (TPL), the country"s sole electric utility, on 14 March.

The 500 kW hybrid PV farm with 1,680 PV modules and 21 SMA Sunny Tripowers was fully integrated into the existing diesel network and provides almost 70 percent of Vava"u"s energy demands at noon. Batteries store part of the energy generated during the day and discharge during the peak in the evening.
